Western Illinois University-Quad Cities Counseling Association Constitution

Adopted April 6, 2017

ARTICLE I Counseling Association

The name of this organization shall be the Western Illinois University-Quad Cities Counseling Association (CA). The CA is a student organization at Western Illinois University-Quad Cities. This organization's purpose shall be to foster the counselor educational development of participants in the counselor education department. This association is a chapter of the Illinois Counseling Association (ICA).

ARTICLE II Objectives

The objectives of the organization shall be:

- 1. To promote interest the counseling profession
- 2. To provide fellowship among students and faculty in the counseling department
- 3. To promote development as professionals through education and community involvement
- 4. To provide a forum for the presentation of innovative ideas to benefit of the University community

ARTICLE III Membership

- 1. Members and officers must be enrolled students at Western Illinois University-Quad Cities.
- 2. Non-students may act as associate members, but may not vote or hold office.

ARTICLE IV Officers

Election of Officers

- a. The officers of this organization are president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer. In addition, there is optional positions for Chi Sigma lota liaison, senator, and social media chair.
- b. Officers will be elected by written ballot, with each active member casting a vote. A majority of votes will constitute a victory. In the case of only one person running for that office, they will be automatically given that spot.
- c. Election of officers for the following year will take place during the April meeting time.
- d. Officers will assume office for the period of one year.

2. Recall of Officers

- a. Officers are subject to recall for malfeasance in office. Malfeasance shall be defined as:
 - i. An inability to perform the requirements of office

ARTICLE IX Statement of Non-Hazing
